My business is solving two problems; the discomfort from aches, pains, and injuries (which I have personally experienced), as well as the impact of droughts on Australian farmers. The burden of drought has caused the farmers' land to dry up, which has a domino effect on their livestock and therefore, their ability to produce enough to keep the farm afloat. For many Australian farmers, their heart and soul go into their farm so it's devastating to witness the havoc of drought.

My solution is two-fold. I sell organic heat packs made from wheat, which act as a natural pain relief from aches, pains, injuries or merely for general comfort. I also donate a portion of the profits to Australian farmers (who I also purchase the wheat from) and I use the platform of my business to spread awareness of farmers who are doing it tough.

My solution is innovative because my heat wheats are eco-friendly; they are plastic-free, chemical-free and made from 100% organic fabrics (cotton, wheat, lavender). My products can also be frozen in an airtight sealed bag and used as a cold pack. I also hand-make each heat wheat (in a variety of sizes) out of fabric with funky designs.

By taking an everyday product (heat wheat) that people use to relieve their aches, pains or injuries and making it out of wheat, I am not only financially supporting Australian farmers by purchasing some of their product (wheat), but I am also able to bend the future by donating a portion of my profits back to them to support with funding green projects, namely planting trees. Further to this, structuring my business as a social enterprise enables me to further spread awareness about the impact of drought on farmers, which can increase support for them. If I won I would require support expanding my connection with farmers and using the prize money to purchase additional material, equipment and upskilling.
